"You may go anywhere in this world, and there I go with you. My abode is in your heart; I dwell within you.

I, who thus abide in your heart, it is Me (inner Light, inner Guru) that you should always worship. Even in the hearts of all the living creatures, it is I alone, who dwell.

Hence, whoever you may come across, in the house or outside of it, or on the way, there are all My manifestations; I pervade them all.

An insect, an ant, creatures living in water or moving in the sky, or animals on the land- a dog or a pig, I pervade them all, most truly and always.

Hence, do not consider yourself as separate from Me. Great is the good fortune of him, who will know Me as not being different from himself."
